




#### If a social worker contacts you about your children, call Legal Aid BC.

If a social worker from the Ministry of Children and Family Development or a delegated Aboriginal agency contacts you or visits your home to ask you questions about your family, this means that they think your child might be at risk and are looking into it. You have the right to get legal advice. Call Legal Aid BC immediately to find out if you qualify for a free lawyer:

#### Ask for a mediator

A mediator can help you work with the ministry. A mediator is specially trained to not take sides. They help people work out conflicts and reach an agreement. Mediators can travel to remote communities.

Mediation is free for families who are involved with the ministry. You can ask for a mediator as soon as a social worker contacts you, or at any time during the child protection process.

Ask your lawyer or social worker for more information. Also see aboriginal.legalaid.bc.ca/child-family-rights/mediation.

#### Parents Legal Centres

Parents Legal Centres (PLC) is a free service in select locations to help parents who qualify address child protection issues early on. PLCs are located in Campbell River, Duncan, Kamloops, Prince George, Smithers, Surrey, Terrace, Vancouver, Victoria, and Williams Lake.
